About Our Poets

Andy Young's first full-length collection, *All Night It Is Morning*, was published by Diálogos Press. She currently teaches at the New Orleans Center for Creative Arts and at Tulane University after working at the American University in Cairo for two years. A graduate of the Warren Wilson Program for Writers, her writing has been published in three chapbooks, in publications in Lebanon, Egypt, Ireland, Mexico, and in U.S. publications such as the *Los Angeles Review of Books*, *Best New Poets*, *Callaloo*, *Guernica*, and the Norton anthology *Language for a New Century*.

Anne Marie Rooney is the author of *Spitshine* (Carnegie Mellon University Press, 2012), as well as two chapbooks. Her work has been featured in the *Best New Poets* and *Best American Poetry* anthologies. She received the Gulf Coast Poetry Prize, the Iowa Review Award, and a Barbara Deming Grant, among other awards. A founding member of Line Assembly, she currently lives and works as a teaching artist in New Orleans.
