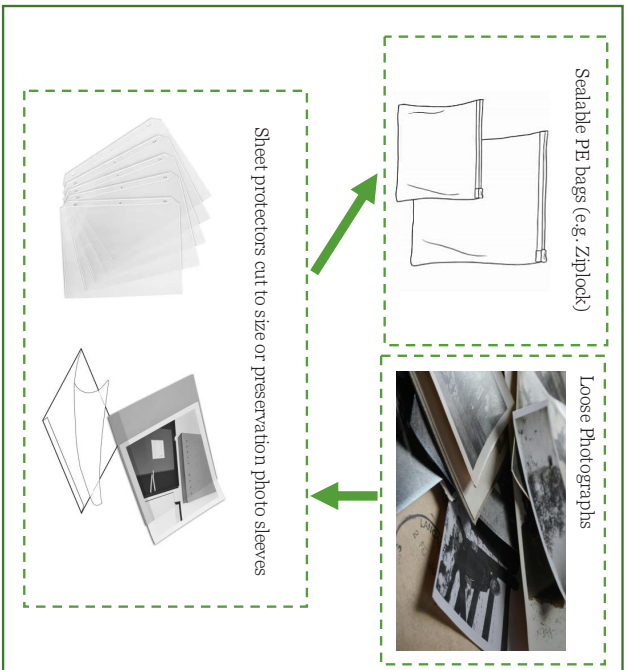
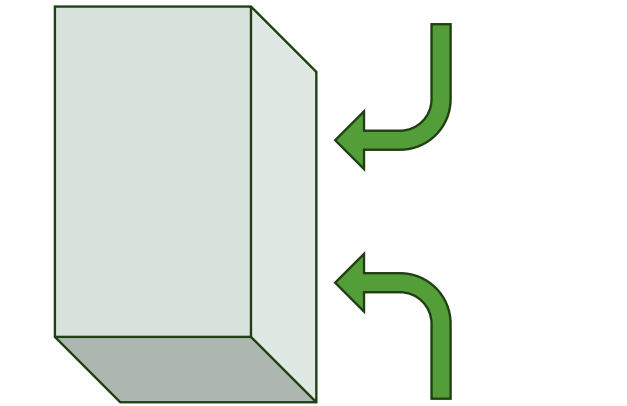
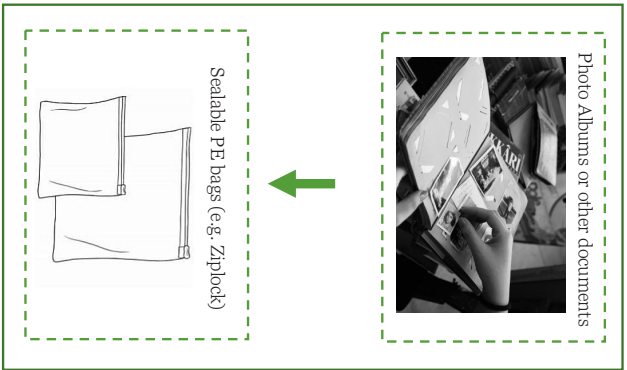




WAYS TO PACK AND STORE YOUR PHOTOGRAPHS





STEPS

1. **Gather your photographs, albums and documents.**
 - a. Decide on what to take and what to leave behind.
 - b. Assess how much materials you have. Do you have just a few loose photographs? Maybe a shoebox worth? Multiple albums?
2. **Gather your supplies.**
 - a. Plastic sleeves (e.g. sheet protectors)
 - b. Sealable polyethylene bags (e.g. Ziploc bags)
 - c. Plastic container (e.g. plastic tub with lid)
Optional: desiccant bags and/or fire retardant bags.
3. **Identify your storage location**
 - a. Place your container/ repository either with your go-bags to remember to take it or find a place inside your home to leave it behind
 - i Not on the attic
 - ii Not in the basement
 - iii Not below any water pipes, windows or A/C vents
 - iv On the floor or elevated on a shelf (e.g. closet)
